Vicinity values its people and their wellbeing and is committed to providing a safe and healthy environment for all team members, contractors, tenants, visitors and customers.

This policy applies to people who carry out work for Vicinity and to Vicinity managed workplaces and shopping centres.

To deliver on our commitment, we have adopted and will maintain a health and safety management framework to support the business to:

- Comply with all legislative requirements, taking into account applicable industry standards
- Ensure team members, contractors and tenants understand their responsibilities with respect to health, safety
- Identify hazards (taking into account known incident trends) and suitable measures commensurate with the risk so
 as to proactively and appropriately manage health and safety risks
- Foster a 'lessons learned' culture, including by maintaining a strong hazard reporting regime and learning from
 incidents by identifying corrective actions that seek to prevent any recurrence or continued exposure to an
 identified risk
- Ensure appropriate health and safety procedures and processes are developed, implemented and followed
- Provide the necessary health and safety information, education, instruction and supervision to team members, contractors and tenants
- Engage, consult and communicate with all stakeholders to build a shared commitment to ongoing health and safety management and, where appropriate a coordinated approach to health and safety management
- Ensure that contractual arrangements entered into for the supply of goods and services include provision for compliance with health and safety requirements
- Provide the required resources, facilities, plant, equipment and systems to enable people to undertake their work safely
- Drive continual improvement through the setting of measurable health and safety objectives and targets aimed at elimination of work-related injury and illness
- Ensure ongoing monitoring, auditing and review of health and safety performance and management systems
- Develop and maintain a strong health and safety culture in which all team members take responsibility for health and safety through strong safety leadership by all
